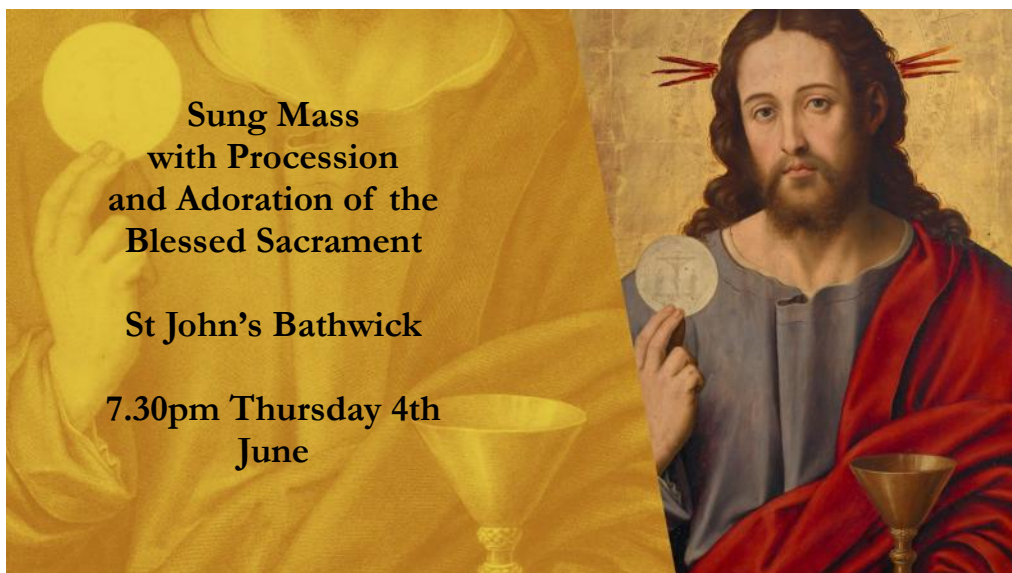

Charity for June: THE CHILDRENS SOCIETY

In the many years since the founding of this Society (when it was called "The Waifs and Strays"), working with the care for these children, their needs still remain vital in cases of fear, neglect, abuse and shattered trusts. The undermining of the young person's rights and honest achievements, has increased into our present time. Children cannot speak for themselves, but the Christian teaching can— and at the very least we owe it to them.

ST MARY'S CHURCH make weekly collections during the Sunday services using the blue "Alms" envelopes which are given away to a different charity each month.

The charity for this month is **Developing Health and Independence (DHI)**. We were fortunate to have a short talk about DHI from the Chief Executive, and Founder of the charity, Rosie Phillips, at the Parish breakfast in March. She explained about the work of the charity with people who have drug or alcohol problems and the range of services that are provided from outreach and needle exchange to structured treatment, relapse prevention and employment support. The charity also works in partnership with Avon and Wiltshire Mental Health Partnership's Integrated Non-Custodial Treatment Requirements (MHTRs). These are court ordered treatments provided as part of a community or suspended sentence. They offer tailored psychological support to people who may not have had any formal help before. These interventions aim to reduce reoffending by addressing underlying causes such as trauma, anxiety, depression or substance misuse. 185 clients were supported in the last financial year in BANES.

Green News

Being man made, canal banks are susceptible to wear and tear not only from human activity but also natural happenings as well. Just as rivers are prone to flooding, especially where there are low banks, so too are canals even though the water is not flowing. This can cause severe problems for wild life living along the banks like water voles who burrow into the banks for shelter and to raise their young.

As a result of recent flooding a stretch of canal bank near Coventry collapsed. A team of volunteers connected to the Canal and River Trust have been working to raise the bank by a foot and reinforcing it with pre-made concrete bags. The bank was then covered with a thick layer of dredged silt for the water voles to burrow into and has been topped with a wild flower turf full of native plants. The turf was laid so that it hangs over the water giving protection not only to the voles but to bees, butterflies and insects.

Water voles have been recorded eating over 220 species of plants especially those found along the waterside such as yellow iris and meadow sweet.

Trees - Trees - Trees.....

“When the roots of a tree began to decay, it spreads death to the branches”

As you can see from the picture above St Mary’s Garden has a good selection of trees giving welcome shade in hot summer days but unfortunately, we do have some sad news. We don’t have to be experts in plant pathology to know that when the roots of a tree start to decay it gradually spreads upwards to the branches and, unfortunately, that is happening to two trees in St Mary’s Garden.

Although it is full of blossom at the moment the laburnum, or golden rod, in the car park is actually very sick. Some of you, particularly if you use the car park regularly, will have noticed that it is leaning more and more. On the advice of the tree surgeon who visited recently, it is dying from the centre and likely to fall. Please don’t park your car underneath it because it could fall at any time.



The other tree in question is not as easily spotted as it is at the bottom end near Bathwick Hill, but it is absolutely covered in fungus. From what I have found out I think it is a type of bracket fungus which has spread all the way up the tree. Brackets are the fruiting structures of many different fungi that cause heartwood decay in standing trees. The fungal bodies or brackets appear in spring, summer and autumn, but weakened trees can topple at any time. Consequently, this tree also has to be removed so you may become aware of quite a large open area when it is done. We will then decide what to do and how to fill the space.



On a happier note, the bare patch of grass has been reseeded so we are hoping the promised heat wave doesn’t last too long!

Called to care

I heard about one of the earliest scientists to get involved in climate change research. When he began, the researcher said, he'd believed that if we could just get the science right, all the challenges could be resolved. The best information would enable humankind to find the right technologies and take the right actions to bring climate change under control. Twenty-five years on, the scientist said, he'd realised he'd got it all wrong. What we need to sort out, he said, is the human heart. We know what to do to address the climate emergency. Our challenge is that we're all too liable to place the actions we need to take into the 'too difficult' box, or just deny there's a problem altogether.

Yet whether we like it or not, the climate emergency is a reality that is advancing upon us. It's seen in rising sea levels and increased freak weather. Talk to our brothers and sisters in Zambia and they'll tell you that the climate emergency is upon them now in increased droughts and floods. Last year the National Emergency Briefing on the Climate and Nature Crisis saw leading experts brief an audience of over 1,200 politicians and leaders from business, culture, faith, sport and the media. The Briefing outlined the implications of climate breakdown for health, food systems, national security and the economy. If you've not seen it please can I encourage you to find out where you can watch it.

I invite us all to think too about the next steps we can take to address an issue we'd probably rather ignore. The Church of England has set the bold target of becoming Carbon Net Zero by 2030. Our churches can make a difference in local communities towards achieving this ambitious goal. I urge you to fill out your church's Carbon Footprint return, sign up to achieve an A Rocha Eco Church Award, make whatever difference you can where you are. Such actions are a sign of us turning around – metanoia as the New Testament puts it – away from denial of what's wrong towards putting things right. Our actions can be signs of the change in heart that all of us need to make.

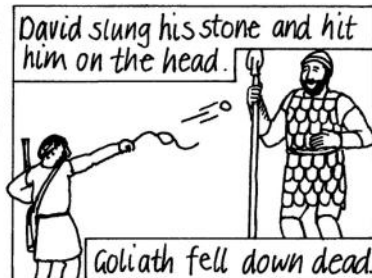
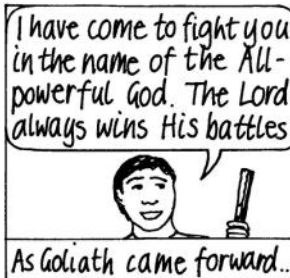
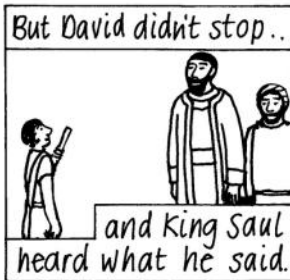
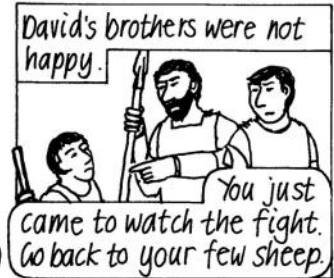
